CHECKLIST [€]

An essay is an extended piece of writing that presents and supports a thesis or proposition.

• Suggested structure for a standard essay:

depends on the instructions

Introduction

- O Begin with a general statement that introduces the topic and shows its importance
- $\odot\,$ Provide some background information on the issue under discussion
- $\odot\,$ Create a well-developed thesis statement that reveals the main arguments

Body

- Begin each body paragraph with a topic sentence
- O Make sure each argument is supported with evidence (research findings, statistical data, personal observations, etc.)
- O End each body paragraph with a concluding statement that restates the argument
- $\odot\,$ Add logical transitions between the sentences in the paragraph
- Include proper citations for the supporting evidence
- Ensure each body paragraph contains one clear argument

Conclusion

- O Restate the topic and its importance in a general fashion
- O Revisit the thesis statement without going into detail and repeating the examples
- O Outline future research possibilities / call for an action / provide an afterthought

Dos

- Include a thesis statement at the end of the introductory paragraph
- Support your arguments with examples
- Add linking devices to ensure a smooth flow of ideas
- Distribute the word count for each paragraph evenly
- 🗸 Use formal language

Don'ts

- Restate the same idea in different words
 Compile miscellaneous ideas in one long paragraph
 End a paragraph with an in-text citation
 Include in-text citations/examples in the conclusion
- S Use contracted forms of words
